

Choosing and Developing a Motif

A **motif** is a recurring object, image, colour, sound, phrase or action that helps communicate the deeper meaning of your writing.

The key is not simply to repeat it. Its meaning should **develop** as the experience or story progresses.

Choose a motif that:

- connects naturally to your central idea;
- can return at important moments;
- reflects changes in the narrator or character;
- means something different—or something deeper—by the ending.

Use the examples below as inspiration, but make the motif fit **your own experience, character and message**.

Introduce it. Return to it. Develop it. Transform it.

A successful motif is not literary copy-and-paste.

1. 📱💔 **A cracked phone screen** — anxiety, damaged relationships or an imperfect self-image.
2. 💬👁️ **An unread message** — regret, avoidance or something important left unsaid.
3. 🎧🎵 **A playlist or recurring song** — friendship, first love, nostalgia or growing apart.
4. 🧥 **A hoodie** — comfort, identity, protection or hiding from the world.
5. 🪞 **A mirror** — insecurity, body image, changing identity or self-acceptance.

Technology and communication

- **A cracked phone screen**   — damaged relationships, anxiety, distorted self-image or appearing fine despite hidden damage.
- **An unread message**   — avoidance, regret, fear or something important left unsaid.
- **A deleted message**   — lost courage, suppressed feelings or the inability to communicate honestly.
- **A missed call**  — guilt, a lost opportunity or a final chance to connect with someone.
- **A voice note**  — intimacy, memory or preserving the voice of someone who is absent.
- **A dying battery**  — emotional exhaustion, burnout or gradually losing connection with others.
- **A notification sound**  — pressure, distraction, anxiety or the constant need for approval.
- **A blank profile picture**  — lost identity, disconnection or someone disappearing from the writer's life.
- **A typing bubble**  — anticipation, uncertainty or waiting for words that never arrive.
- **A location pin**  — independence, control, feeling watched or searching for somewhere to belong.
- **A password**  — trust, secrecy or the parts of ourselves we protect from others.
- **A games controller**  — escapism, friendship, competition or feeling that someone else is in control.
- **A phone alarm**  — routine, dread, pressure or the moment change begins.

- **A frozen screen**  — feeling trapped, overwhelmed or unable to move forward.

Clothing and personal belongings

- **A hoodie**  — comfort, protection, identity or hiding from the world.
- **A pair of trainers**  — growing up, belonging, independence or moving forward.
- **Football boots**   — ambition, family expectations, injury, disappointment or letting go of a dream.
- **A school blazer or tie**  — conformity, pressure, belonging or leaving school behind.
- **An old T-shirt**  — comfort, memory, a past relationship or an identity the writer has outgrown.
- **A hat or cap**  — confidence, belonging or a public identity that conceals insecurity.
- **A ring**  — family, inheritance, love, commitment or a relationship that has changed.
- **A watch**  — pressure, waiting, mortality or fear of wasting time.
- **A pair of glasses**  — perspective, insecurity or finally seeing a situation clearly.
- **A school bag**  — responsibility, academic pressure or emotional weight.
- **A loose thread**  — uncertainty, unravelling relationships or an identity coming apart.
- **A uniform**  — conformity, discipline, belonging or the conflict between public and private identity.
- **A pair of laces**  — dependence, growing independence or gradually learning to manage alone.

- **A cup of tea** ☕ — comfort, family rituals, difficult conversations or grief within ordinary moments.
- **An empty chair** 🪑 — absence, separation, bereavement or someone who remains emotionally present.
- **A bedroom door** 🚪 — privacy, conflict, isolation or eventual reconnection.
- **A key** 🔑 — trust, independence, responsibility, secrecy or access to a difficult memory.
- **A mirror** 🪞 — identity, body image, insecurity or growing self-acceptance.
- **A candle** 🕯️ — memory, grief, hope or the fragility of life.
- **A window** 🪟 — feeling trapped, watching life from a distance or imagining another future.
- **A family photograph** 🖼️ — memory, belonging or the gap between appearances and reality.
- **A childhood toy** 🧸 — innocence, security, growing up or a childhood experience that still matters.
- **An empty plate** 🍽️ — absence, poverty, family tension or a difficult relationship with food.
- **A chipped mug** ☕ — imperfection, family history or something damaged that remains valuable.

 - **An old coat** 🧥 — protection, bereavement or carrying the presence of its former owner.
 - **A clock** 🕒 — waiting, family routine, passing time or the approach of an unavoidable change.
 - **An unopened room** 🚪 — grief, avoidance or a memory the writer is not ready to confront.
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School, expectations and growing up

- **A marked essay** 📄 — fear of failure, self-worth or discovering that a grade does not define someone.
- **A chewed pencil** ✎ — nervousness, frustration or struggling to find the right words.
- **A pen that stops working** 🖋 — creative doubt, silence or feeling unable to communicate.
- **An unopened book** 📖 — missed potential, lost confidence or a story the writer is not ready to face.
- **An exam timetable** 📅 — pressure, expectations or feeling that the future has been reduced to dates and grades.
- **A trophy or medal** 🏆 — achievement, competition or the emptiness of succeeding only to please others.
- **A medal hidden in a drawer** 🏅 — faded success, a past identity or an achievement that no longer feels important.
- **A school bell** 🔔 — routine, control, freedom or time steadily running out.

- **A school photograph** 📷 — changing identity or being trapped inside an earlier version of yourself.
 - **An empty classroom** 🏫 — endings, loneliness or the realisation that a stage of life is over.
 - **A locker** 🗄️ — privacy, secrets or an identity kept separate from home life.
 - **A report card** 📄 — parental expectations, pressure or the conflict between achievement and happiness.
 - **A calculator** 🧮 — comparison, measurable success or the fear of being reduced to a number.
 - **A staircase** 🪜 — progress, difficulty or fear of what comes next.
 - **A name written on a page** 📝 — identity, ownership or learning to speak for yourself.
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💖 Friendship, love and relationships

- **A playlist** 🎧 — friendship, first love, nostalgia or growing apart.
- **A recurring song** 🎵 — shared memories, comfort or emotions the writer cannot express directly.
- **A friendship bracelet** 🧵 — loyalty, belonging or a relationship that has faded.
- **An unopened present** 📁 — unresolved conflict, guilt or affection the writer cannot yet accept.
- **A concert or cinema ticket** 🎫 — a shared experience, changing friendship or a moment preserved from the past.
- **A handwritten note** 📝 — affection, apology, encouragement or words that gain importance over time.
- **A missing puzzle piece** 🧩 — loneliness, belonging or the search for someone who understands us.

- **A magnet**  — attraction, loyalty or two people repeatedly drawn back together.
- **A knot**  — loyalty, tension or a relationship that becomes difficult to untangle.
- **A balloon**  — celebration, fragility or accepting that something must be released.
- **An inside joke**  — belonging, intimacy or the sadness of no longer sharing the same connection.
- **A nickname**  — affection, embarrassment, identity or an earlier version of the writer.
- **A shared meal**  — friendship, belonging or growing distance when someone's place becomes empty.
- **A borrowed item**  — trust, memory or a relationship that ended before the object could be returned.

Journeys, places and transitions

- **A bus ticket**   — independence, transition or the first journey taken alone.
- **A train journey**  — leaving, change or moving towards an uncertain future.
- **A bus stop**  — waiting, feeling left behind or standing between two stages of life.
- **A road**  — choices, uncertainty or the direction a life is taking.
- **A bridge**  — transition, reconciliation or finding the courage to move forward.
- **Traffic lights**  — hesitation, control or learning when to stop and when to continue.
- **A map**  — searching for direction or discovering that life cannot always be planned.

- **A suitcase**  — leaving home, emotional baggage or choosing what to carry forward.
- **An old house**  — childhood, family history or a past that feels familiar yet distant.
- **An empty playground**  — lost innocence, loneliness or recognising how much has changed.
- **A familiar street**  — belonging, memory or seeing a childhood place through older eyes.
- **A station platform**  — choices, separation, waiting or a point of no return.
- **A passport**  — identity, freedom, cultural belonging or the chance to begin again.
- **A gate**  — opportunity, restriction or crossing into a new stage of life.
- **Footprints**  — influence, memory or deciding whether to follow someone else's path.

Nature, weather and light

- **Rain**  — sadness, grief, emotional release or renewal.
- **A storm**  — conflict, fear, emotional turmoil or a crisis that must be endured.
- **Clouds**  — uncertainty, low mood or thoughts that obscure hope.
- **Sunlight**  — happiness, exposure, hope or finally seeing clearly.
- **A sunrise**  — recovery, a new beginning or cautious optimism.
- **A sunset**  — endings, acceptance or appreciating something before it disappears.
- **The moon**  — loneliness, change or comfort found in something constant.

- **A star** 🌟 — ambition, guidance, memory or a goal that seems unreachable.
- **A falling leaf** 🍂 — ageing, loss, change or accepting a natural ending.
- **A plant or seedling** 🌱 — personal growth, recovery or progress that initially goes unnoticed.
- **A tree** 🌳 — family roots, endurance or change across generations.
- **A flower** 🌸 — affection, beauty, fragility or growth.
- **A dying flower** 🌼 — loss, fading love or something beautiful that cannot last.
- **A bird** 🐦 — freedom, escape or the courage to leave somewhere familiar.
- **A feather** 🖋️ — fragility, memory or the lightness that comes from letting go.
- **The sea** 🌊 — freedom, grief, uncertainty or forces beyond our control.
- **Tides** 🌊 — recurring emotions, relationships or memories that repeatedly return.
- **Snow** ❄️ — silence, isolation, purity or covering something that remains underneath.
- **Fog** 🌫️ — confusion, uncertainty or being unable to imagine the future.
- **Fire** 🔥 — anger, destruction, passion, warmth or transformation.

Colours as motifs

A colour becomes an effective motif when its meaning develops—not simply because the writer keeps mentioning it.

- **Green** 🟢 — hope, ambition, envy, growth or pursuing something that remains out of reach.
- **Blue** 🔵 — sadness, loneliness, calmness, safety or eventual peace.
- **Red** 🔴 — love, anger, danger, shame, passion or grief.

- **Yellow** 🟡 — happiness, childhood, anxiety, warning or forced cheerfulness.
- **Orange** 🟠 — warmth, energy, autumn, warning or approaching change.
- **Purple** 🟣 — individuality, creativity, pride, identity or mourning.
- **Pink** 🌸 — affection, vulnerability, childhood or expectations surrounding gender and identity.
- **Black** ⬛ — grief, fear, concealment, rebellion or strength.
- **White** ⬜ — innocence, emptiness, silence, perfection or a new beginning.
- **Grey** 🟤 — numbness, routine, uncertainty, depression or feeling invisible.
- **Brown** 🟤 — home, stability, tradition, nature or feeling trapped in the familiar.
- **Gold** 🟡 ✨ — success, ambition, value or discovering that achievement can feel hollow.
- **Silver** 🤍 ✨ — memory, maturity or something beautiful but emotionally cold.
- **A fading colour** 🌫️ — weakening memories, loss or a relationship gradually disappearing.
- **A colour becoming brighter** 🌈 — recovery, confidence or the return of hope.
- **A changing colour palette** 🌈 — developing identity, emotional growth or movement towards self-acceptance.

Literary link: If you are studying *The Great Gatsby*, you will recognise how the green light carries ideas of hope, ambition and unreachable dreams. Use the principle — but create your own meaning.

Sounds, phrases and sensations

- **A ticking clock** 🕒 — pressure, waiting, mortality or approaching change.

- **A door slamming** 🚪 ✨ — conflict, rejection or emotional distance.
- **Someone's laugh** 😂 — affection, belonging or the memory of someone absent.
- **A familiar voice** 🗣️ — reassurance, identity or a connection that survives separation.
- **Silence** 😬 — tension, grief, secrecy or things a family cannot discuss.
- **A repeated question** ❓ — uncertainty, guilt or something the writer still cannot answer.
- **A repeated piece of advice** 💬 — guidance that initially seems irritating but later gains significance.
- **A name** 🏷️ — identity, belonging or the difference between how others see us and how we see ourselves.
- **An apology** 🙏 — guilt, healing or words that arrive too late.
- **A familiar perfume** 🌸 — memory, grief or being suddenly transported into the past.
- **The smell of familiar food** 🍪 — home, culture, family or belonging.
- **A particular sweet** 🍬 — childhood, innocence or memories associated with someone important.
- **Steam rising from a drink** ☕ ☁️ — warmth, brief comfort or emotions that cannot be held forever.
- **A heartbeat** 💓 — fear, excitement, vulnerability or survival.
- **A recurring dream** 💭 — anxiety, desire or an experience the writer has not resolved.



 TOP 10 MOTIFS FOR CREATIVE FOLIO WRITING

These work particularly well in short stories because they can build atmosphere, foreshadow events and reveal character without explaining everything directly.

1.  **A flickering light** — uncertainty, danger, fading hope or a truth struggling to emerge.
2.  **A stopped clock** — trauma, death, a life trapped in the past or one moment that changed everything.
3.  **An old photograph** — buried memories, family secrets or a past that is not quite what it seems.
4.  **A recurring song or melody** — memory, grief, warning or an unseen connection between characters.
5.  **A reflection** — fractured identity, self-deception or a character becoming someone they no longer recognise.
6.  **A loose red thread** — relationships unravelling, danger drawing closer or seemingly separate events becoming connected.
7.  **Footsteps** — fear, guilt, pursuit or the past following the character.
8.  **Rain** — grief, isolation, emotional release or eventual renewal.
9.  **A bird** — freedom, entrapment, escape or a warning that something is about to change.
10.  **The colour red** — love, danger, violence, guilt or a secret that becomes increasingly difficult to conceal.

MOTIF IDEAS FOR NATIONAL 5 AND HIGHER SHORT STORIES

A motif is a recurring image, object, colour, sound, phrase or idea that gains significance as a story develops.

In a successful creative piece, a motif might:

- create atmosphere;
- reveal a character's feelings;
- foreshadow an event;



MOTIF IDEAS FOR NATIONAL 5 AND HIGHER PERSONAL WRITING

- connect different moments;
- represent the central theme;
- conceal or reveal a truth;
- change meaning after a twist;
- make the ending feel satisfying.

The motif should return at **carefully chosen moments**. If it appears constantly, it may begin to feel forced—or as though the writer has temporarily misplaced every other technique.

Objects, rooms and hidden secrets

- **A locked door**   — secrecy, grief, fear, repression or a truth the character refuses to confront.
- **A key**  — access, trust, responsibility or knowledge the character may regret discovering.
- **A broken key**   — lost opportunity, powerlessness or a truth that can no longer be contained.
- **An open window**  — freedom, vulnerability, escape or an invitation to danger.
- **A cracked window**   — fractured safety or a threat entering a familiar place.
- **A mirror**  — identity, self-deception, guilt or becoming someone unfamiliar.
- **A covered mirror**   — grief, superstition, shame or refusal to face the truth.
- **A staircase**  — progress, danger or descent into memory and fear.
- **An empty room**  — absence, loneliness or evidence of something deliberately removed.
- **A hidden drawer**  — secrets, forbidden knowledge or a concealed identity.

- **An attic** 🏠 — forgotten history, family secrets or memories stored out of sight.
- **A basement** 🕳️ — buried fear, guilt or the darker parts of a character's mind.
- **A music box** 🎵 📦 — childhood, innocence, memory or an unsettling connection with the past.
- **A broken ornament** 🏺 — damaged relationships, family conflict or an attempt to hide wrongdoing.
- **A rocking chair** 🪑 — absence, memory or the suggestion that someone—or something—is still present.
- **An empty picture frame** 🖼️ — missing identity, erased history or someone deliberately forgotten.
- **A candle** 🕯️ — hope, life, memory or safety gradually being extinguished.
- **A flickering bulb** 💡 — uncertainty, danger or a truth struggling to emerge.
- **A stain** 🩸 — guilt, violence, memory or something that cannot be completely removed.
- **A crack in a wall** 🧱 — instability, concealed damage or pressure building beneath the surface.

Time, memory and the past

- **A stopped clock** 🕒 — trauma, death or a character emotionally trapped in one moment.
- **A ticking clock** 🕒 — pressure, approaching danger or limited time.
- **A watch running backwards** ⌚ ↺️ — distorted memory, regret or a supernatural disturbance.
- **A missing date on a calendar** 📅 — erased memory, avoidance or an event someone refuses to acknowledge.

- **A birthday card** 🎂 💌 — growing older, absence or a relationship frozen in the past.
 - **An old photograph** 📷 — memory, family secrets or a past that has been misremembered.

 - **A diary** 📖 — hidden identity, unreliable memory or access to another character's private life.
 - **An unfinished letter** ✉️ — interrupted truth, regret or words that arrived too late.
 - **A childhood toy** 🧸 — innocence, trauma or something from the past that refuses to remain buried.
 - **A recurring memory** 💭 — guilt, grief or an event whose true meaning is gradually revealed.
 - **A familiar smell** 🌸 — involuntary memory, home, danger or the presence of someone absent.
 - **A scar** 💧 — survival, violence or physical evidence of a hidden history.
 - **An old newspaper cutting** 📰 — forgotten crime, family history or a public version of a private tragedy.
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Sounds, voices and silence

- **Footsteps** 👣 — pursuit, guilt, fear or the past following the character.
- **A recurring knock** 🚪 📢 — warning, opportunity or something demanding to be acknowledged.
- **A ringing telephone** 📞 — urgency, connection or a truth the character is afraid to hear.
- **A voice message** 🗣️ — memory, evidence or the preserved voice of someone absent.

- **A recurring song** 🎵 — love, loss, manipulation or an emotional connection across time.
 - **A music-box melody** 🎶 — childhood innocence transformed into unease.
 - **A lullaby** 🧸 🎵 — protection, family memory or something comforting that becomes threatening.
 - **A whisper** 🗣️ — secrecy, paranoia or a truth that cannot yet be spoken openly.
 - **Someone's laugh** 😂 — affection, memory or an unsettling reminder of someone who has gone.
 - **A heartbeat** 💓 — fear, guilt, attraction or survival.
 - **Heavy breathing** 🧘 — panic, pursuit or an unseen presence drawing closer.
 - **A dripping tap** 🚰 — tension, passing time or a character's growing inability to ignore something.
 - **A train whistle** 🚂 — departure, escape or an opportunity disappearing.
 - **A school bell** 🔔 — routine, control or the approach of a decisive moment.
 - **Silence** 🤫 — grief, threat, secrecy or communication breaking down.
 - **A repeated phrase** 💬 — warning, memory, manipulation or words whose true meaning emerges later.
 - **A name spoken repeatedly** 🗣️ — identity, haunting, guilt or an attempt to reach someone.
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Weather, nature and landscape

- **Rain** 🌧️ — grief, loneliness, cleansing or emotional release.
- **A storm** ⚡ — conflict, fear or an approaching crisis.
- **Thunder** ⚡ — warning, anger or a sudden interruption of safety.

- **Lightning** ⚡ — revelation, violence or a brief glimpse of the truth.
- **Fog** 🌫️ — confusion, secrecy, uncertainty or limited understanding.

- **Ice** 🧊 — emotional distance, danger or feelings kept frozen.
- **Wind** 💨 — change, instability or an unseen force influencing events.
- **The sea** 🌊 — freedom, danger, grief or forces beyond human control.
- **The tide** 🌊 ↔ — returning memories, unavoidable change or the past repeatedly resurfacing.
- **A river** 🏞️ — time, transition or events that cannot be reversed.
- **A tree** 🌳 — family, endurance, roots or secrets passed through generations.
- **A damaged tree** 🌳 💔 — broken family relationships or survival after trauma.
- **Falling leaves** 🍂 — ageing, loss or inevitable change.
- **A flower** 🌸 — love, innocence or fragile hope.
- **A dying flower** 🌸 🩸 — fading love, illness or approaching loss.
- **A seedling** 🌱 — renewal, recovery or hope beginning unnoticed.

- **A crow or raven** 🐦 — death, observation, intelligence or approaching danger.
- **A moth** 🦋 — obsession, vulnerability or attraction to something destructive.
- **A spider's web** 🕸️ — entrapment, manipulation or connections gradually becoming visible.
- **Footprints in snow or mud** 👣 — presence, pursuit or evidence that someone was not alone.



Colours as creative motifs

A colour can develop atmosphere while also representing a character, emotion or central theme.

- **Red**  — love, violence, danger, anger, guilt or a truth that cannot remain hidden.
- **Green**  — hope, jealousy, decay, ambition or something desired but out of reach.
- **Blue**  — calmness, grief, loneliness, emotional distance or freedom.
- **Yellow**  — happiness, illness, warning, cowardice or cheerfulness that feels artificial.
- **Orange**  — warmth, fire, energy, warning or approaching change.
- **Purple**  — power, mystery, imagination, identity or mourning.
- **Pink**  — affection, innocence, vulnerability or expectations placed upon a character.
- **Black**  — death, secrecy, fear, rebellion or hidden strength.
- **White**  — innocence, emptiness, silence, perfection or deception concealed beneath purity.
- **Grey**  — numbness, uncertainty, routine or a world drained of hope.
- **Brown**  — earth, home, decay, tradition or something old and neglected.
- **Gold**  — wealth, ambition, temptation or success that proves hollow.
- **Silver**   — the moon, memory, emotional coldness or supernatural influence.
- **A colour gradually fading**  — lost memory, weakening hope or a relationship disappearing.
- **A colour becoming brighter**  — growing confidence, revelation or recovery.

- **A colour appearing where it should not** 🎨 ! — danger, supernatural disruption or reality becoming unreliable.
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Character and identity

- **A reflection** 🪞 — identity, duality or a character becoming someone they fear.
 - **A shadow** 🧛 — hidden identity, guilt or the darker side of a character.
 - **A mask** 😬 — deception, social expectations or the difference between public and private identity.
 - **A name** 🏷️ — belonging, reputation or the struggle to define oneself.
 - **A nickname** 💬 — affection, control or an identity imposed by others.
 - **A photograph of the character** 📷 — changing identity or evidence that contradicts their memory.
 - **A uniform** 👔 — conformity, authority or the suppression of individuality.
 - **A pair of gloves** 🧤 — concealment, emotional distance or avoidance of responsibility.
 - **A coat** 🧥 — protection, disguise or the continuing presence of its former owner.
 - **A tattoo or mark** 🖋️ — identity, loyalty, survival or a past that cannot be erased.
 - **A cracked pair of glasses** 🕶️ — distorted perception or a character's understanding breaking down.
 - **A double or repeated face** 👤 — divided identity, paranoia or an unreliable sense of reality.
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Relationships, grief and absence

- **An empty chair** 🪑 — death, separation or someone who remains emotionally present.



MOTIF IDEAS FOR NATIONAL 5 AND HIGHER PERSONAL WRITING

- **An untouched cup** 🍵 — absence, waiting or a routine that continues after loss.
- **A place set at the table** 🍽️ — denial, memory or refusing to accept someone's absence.
- **A wedding ring** 💍 — love, loyalty, betrayal or the end of a relationship.
- **A borrowed item** 📦 — connection, unfinished business or a relationship interrupted.
- **A gift** 📁 — affection, guilt, manipulation or a final message.
- **A pressed flower** 🌸 📖 — preserved love, memory or something beautiful that cannot remain alive.
- **A scarf** 🧣 — warmth, memory or the physical trace of an absent person.
- **A familiar perfume** 🌹 — love, memory, grief or the suggestion that someone has returned.
- **An unanswered letter** ✉️ — rejection, misunderstanding or a truth never communicated.
- **A photograph turned face-down** 🖼️ — anger, grief or a relationship the character cannot confront.
- **Two cups becoming one** 🍵 — separation, loss or a character slowly accepting solitude.

Journeys, choices and change

- **A crossroads** ➕ — choice, uncertainty or competing futures.
- **A bridge** 🌉 — transition, reconciliation or crossing a point of no return.
- **A road** 🛣️ — destiny, freedom or a life shaped by decisions.
- **A train** 🚆 — escape, separation or an opportunity that will not wait.
- **A bus ticket** 🎫 — independence, chance or proof of a journey someone denies taking.



MOTIF IDEAS FOR NATIONAL 5 AND HIGHER PERSONAL WRITING

- **A suitcase**  — escape, emotional baggage or preparing to abandon one identity.
- **A map**  — control, confusion or the failure of carefully made plans.
- **A compass**  — guidance, morality or losing a sense of direction.
- **Traffic lights**  — hesitation, control or knowing when to act.
- **A gate**  — restriction, opportunity or entry into the unknown.
- **A tunnel**  — fear, transition or moving through darkness towards understanding.
- **A lighthouse**   — guidance, isolation, warning or unreachable safety.
- **A path becoming overgrown**  — neglected memory, abandoned ambitions or a truth deliberately avoided.

Phrases, actions and repeated behaviour

Motifs do not have to be physical objects.

- **“I’m fine.”**  — denial, emotional suppression or a façade gradually breaking.
- **“See you tomorrow.”**  — hope, dramatic irony or a promise that cannot be fulfilled.
- **“Don’t look back.”**  — warning, regret or the impossibility of escaping the past.
- **“It’s nothing.”**  — concealment or danger being deliberately underestimated.
- **Counting**  — anxiety, control or a coping mechanism beginning to fail.
- **Checking a lock**  — fear, paranoia or guilt.
- **Washing hands**  — guilt, contamination or an impossible attempt to feel clean.
- **Looking over one’s shoulder**  — fear, pursuit or a guilty conscience.



MOTIF IDEAS FOR NATIONAL 5 AND HIGHER PERSONAL WRITING

- **Touching a scar**  — trauma, memory or the return of fear.
 - **Straightening an object**  — a need for control while life becomes increasingly chaotic.
 - **Lighting a candle**  — remembrance, hope or communication with the past.
 - **Leaving food untouched**  — grief, anxiety or loss of control.
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Quick creative motif planner

1. What is my story really about?

Grief? Identity? Ambition? Fear? Guilt? Freedom? Family? Change?

2. What could represent that idea?

Choose an object, colour, sound, phrase, image or repeated action.

3. What does it mean initially?

What does the reader first believe it represents?

4. Where will it return?

Place it at important moments—not randomly in every paragraph.

5. How will its meaning change?

Can it become more threatening, hopeful, revealing or emotionally significant?

6. What will it reveal at the climax or twist?

Could the reader suddenly understand its earlier appearances differently?

7. How will it appear at the end?

Its final return should show what has changed—or what tragically has not.

Three possible motif journeys

Flickering light: fear to understanding

- **Opening:** The light flickers whenever the character passes an abandoned room.



MOTIF IDEAS FOR NATIONAL 5 AND HIGHER PERSONAL WRITING

- **Rising action:** It flickers as forgotten memories begin to return.
- **Climax:** The light goes out when the character finally enters.
- **Ending:** Morning light fills the room after the truth is accepted.

Stopped clock: trauma to release

- **Opening:** A clock has remained stopped at 3:17 for years.
- **Rising action:** The time appears elsewhere throughout the story.
- **Climax:** The character remembers what happened at 3:17.
- **Ending:** They repair the clock—or choose to remove it entirely.

Red: affection to warning

- **Opening:** Red represents the warmth of a character's favourite scarf.
- **Rising action:** Small flashes of red appear as danger approaches.
- **Climax:** The scarf reveals the connection between the character and the central event.
- **Ending:** Red becomes the colour of memory rather than fear.

Start with an ordinary detail. Give it a hidden meaning. Let its final appearance change how we understand the entire story.
